


We Treat 390 Million Gallons of Sewage Per Day






The Wastewater Budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 is \$773 Million





How do we pay for these expenses?





User Charges are collected through two programs:

Service Charge

Collected on the property tax bill from residential and commercial properties based on an estimated discharge

Industrial Waste Surcharge

Collected from Industrial Users directly based on measured discharge



Why do we have a "special" Industrial Waste Permitting Program?



Clean Water Act of 1972

- Use Best Available Control Technology (BACT) for pretreatment of industrial waste
- Enforce standardized regulations for categories of industrial operations (i.e. Federal Pretreatment Standards)
- Require sampling and monitoring of industrial discharges



Why have a separate program for Industrial Users?

- Ensure industrial users pay their fair share of conveyance and treatment costs
- Recover the cost of administering the IW Permitting Program



What is an IW Discharger's User Charge based on?

- Flow
- Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD)
- Suspended Solids (SS)
- Peak





How do we know how much an Industrial user discharges?

- Data collected periodically through sampling by the Industrial User as required under their permit (Self Monitoring)
- Data collected through sampling by LACSD Monitoring Crews
- Annual Surcharge Filing



Exemption Statement

Less than 1 million gallons per year including sanitary wastewater.
Total flow discharged to sewer + sanitary deduction < 1 MGY

Equal or less than Districts' average strengths:

District	COD (mg/l)	SS (mg/l)
Joint Outfall (JO)	1,250	335
4	1,389	112
14	616	285
20	603	283
Santa Clarita Valley (SCV)	585	272

Exempt companies pay through the property tax bill



Short Form

- Less than 6 million gallon per year
- Less than average wastewater strengths
- May choose to file Long Form



Long Form

- More than 6 million gallons per year
- High wastewater strengths
- Peak charge
- Require frequent testing



Frequency of Tests

Surcharge Requirements – Frequency of Tests		
Yearly Cumulative Flow Volume From Each Discharge Outlet (Million Gallons)	Required Testing Frequency	
15.00 and less	1 per 3 months	
15.01 to 40.00	1 per 2 months	
40.01 to 100.00	2 per month	
100.01 to 250.00	1 per week	
Over 250	2 per week	



User Charge

- Hospitals
 - Acute Care
 - Skilled Nursing and/or Intermediate Care
- Long Form/Short Form option



The Connection Fee Program

- Based on quantity and strength of the wastewater discharged
- New or renewed permit
- Evaluated at the end of the fiscal year
- Exceed 25% of established baseline



Connection Fee - Options

- Payment in full
- Extended payment schedule
- Demonstration



Common Errors

- Transcription errors
- Rounding errors
- Missing information



Wastewater Sampling Tips

- LACSD sample data
 - All sample data
 - Fact sheet
- Flow-weighting for direct measurement
 - Based on flow volume
 - Use frequency of tests table
- Split samples
 - Average before including on Table 3



Estimated Quarters

Gross Surcharge Payable (Previous FY): \$52,781.60

Divide by 4: **\$13,195.40**

Round to nearest dollar: \$13,195.00

This amount should be paid for each of the first three quarters of the new fiscal year






Long Form Payment Due Dates
