

1.7 RESPONSES TO LEISURE LAKE COMMENTS

Three comment letters and 30 form letters were received from residents of the Leisure Lake community opposing consideration of Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 as an alternative location of effluent storage reservoirs. In addition, a petition signed by over 150 people was submitted opposing Storage Reservoir Study Area 3.

COMMENT LETTER 67: DAVID TIMOK, NOVEMBER 18, 2003

Comment 67-1

The comment requests that Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 be removed from consideration in the Final EIR. Pursuant to CEQA requirements, the EIR must evaluate all reasonable alternative locations for each component of the project. Due to its proximity to the LWRP, Study Area 3 is a reasonable alternative location for storage reservoirs. Following an extensive evaluation process of a total of five alternative storage reservoir locations around the LWRP, District No. 14 eliminated Study Areas 1, 3, 4, and 5 from consideration and recommended that storage reservoirs be constructed in Study Area 2, which is north of the LWRP. The principal reason for rejecting Study Area 3 was the proximity of the Leisure Lake community near the intersection of Avenue E and SR-14. See Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 Master Response.

Comment 67-2

The comment letter included a petition that was signed by 267 people. The petition requests that Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 be removed from consideration in the Final EIR. See response to comment 67-1. see Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 Master Response.

Comment 67-3

The comment letter included 25 signed form letters as an attachment. The form letters express opposition to Storage Reservoir Study Area 3. See response to comment 67-1. See Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 Master Response.

COMMENT LETTER 68: DAVID TIMOK, OCTOBER 17, 2003

Comment 68-1

The comment requests that Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 be removed from consideration in the Final EIR citing odor, air quality, and environmental hazards as reasons for eliminating the alternative location. The Draft EIR evaluated potential effects of citing storage reservoirs in the area and identified mitigation measures to reduce the effects. Ultimately, Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 was rejected due to its proximity to the Leisure Lake community near the intersection of Avenue E and SR-14. See response to comment 67-1. See Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 Master Response.

COMMENT LETTER 69: SILVIE RODRIGUEZ

Comment 69-1

The comment requests that Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 be removed from consideration in the Final EIR. Pursuant to CEQA requirements for an analysis of feasible alternatives, the Draft EIR assessed several feasible sites to construct storage reservoirs, including Storage Reservoir Study Area 3. Chapter 5 of the Final EIR describes the storage reservoir study area screening process. Ultimately, Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 was rejected due to its proximity to the Leisure Lake community near the intersection of Avenue E and SR-14. See Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 Master Response.

Comment 69-2

The comment states that more than the three residents mentioned in the Draft EIR would be displaced if storage reservoir Study Area #3 was used. The Final EIR identifies residents within the footprint of the storage reservoir site. Neighboring residents would not be displaced.

Comment 69-3

The comment suggests that storage reservoirs could affect groundwater quality. The Final EIR evaluates potential impacts to groundwater quality from storage reservoirs on page 4-65. The Final EIR commits District No. 14 to implementing mitigation measures that would ensure protection of groundwater quality. See Groundwater Protection Master Response and Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 Master Response.

Comment 69-4

The comment states that the Draft EIR concludes that construction of storage reservoirs in Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 would result in increased nitrates in groundwater and would require more chemicals. The comment is referring to the Draft EIR's conclusions regarding Alternative 3 and is confusing this program alternative with the Storage Reservoir Study Area 3. Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 would not result in greater groundwater impacts or chemical storage than any of the other storage reservoir study areas.

Comment 69-5

The comment describes the stress that residents of Leisure Lake have endured associated with the prospect that storage reservoirs could be sited in Storage Reservoir Study Area 3. Pursuant to CEQA requirements, the EIR must evaluate all reasonable alternative locations for each component of the project. Following an extensive evaluation process of a total of five alternative storage reservoir locations around the LWRP, District No. 14 eliminated Study Areas 1, 3, 4, and 5 from consideration and recommended that storage reservoirs be constructed in Study Area 2, which is north of the LWRP. The principal reason for rejecting Study Area 3 was the proximity of the Leisure Lake community near the intersection of Avenue E and SR-14.

Comment 69-6

The comment states that District No. 14 intentionally minimizes potential effects of the project. The Draft EIR does not down-play the potential environmental effects associated with implementation of the LWRP 2020 Plan. The Draft and Final EIRs assesses environmental impacts pursuant to CEQA requirements. See Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 Master Response.

Comment 69-7

The comment states that constructing storage reservoirs in Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 would constitute a disproportionate impact to low-income elderly people living at the Leisure Lake community. Section 15131 of the CEQA Guidelines states that, “economic or social effects of a project shall not be treated as significant effects on the environment.” Nonetheless, the Final EIR discusses environmental justice issues on page 4-194. Chapter 5 of the Final EIR identifies the five feasible locations surrounding the LWRP that were evaluated for suitability in constructing storage reservoirs. District No. 14 eliminated Study Areas 1, 3, 4, and 5 from consideration and recommended that storage reservoirs be constructed in Study Area 2, which is north of the LWRP. The principal reason for rejecting Study Area 3 was the proximity of the Leisure Lake community near the intersection of Avenue E and SR-14. The Final EIR identifies the community on page 5-16.

Comment 69-8

The comment asks if a list of chemicals has been sent to the health department. The list of stored chemicals is submitted to the local fire department pursuant to State of California hazardous materials storage requirements. The Final EIR provides this information in Table 4.10-1.

Comment 69-9

The comment describes the history of the Redman. The comment is noted.

Comment 69-10

The comment asks why earlier notice was not provided for the public hearing and public review of the Draft EIR. See Public Notification Master Response.

Comment 69-11

The comment letter included a petition that was signed by 270 people. The petition requests that Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 be removed from consideration in the Final EIR. See response to comment 68-1, see Storage Reservoir Study Area 3 Master Response.

I attended the public meeting in Lancaster, October 30, and made my comments on behalf of Goodyork Inc. and Summit Properties (dba Leisure Lake Mobile Estates), and the residents of Leisure Lake. I appreciate the cooperation of your staff, especially Stan, who I spoke with and expressed our concerns about the 2020 facilities plan. I am submitting this request for consideration prior to your recommendations to District 14.

The proposed alternative storage reservoir (study area 3 on your figure 7-6) is directly east and northeast of Leisure Lake. This 211 space senior community is located at the corner of 20th West and Avenue E. My request is that you remove study area 3 from the map, as an alternative storage site, or for any other use on the LWKP 2020 plan. If not removed from the map, then I request an environmental impact study to determine the effect of the storage reservoir upon the senior citizens of Leisure Lake, including health issues, air quality, water wells (the source of water for the park), and property values.



City of Lancaster Incorporated Los Angeles County







Residential Uses. None of the study areas would result in the displacement of a significant number of residences. Comparatively, Study Area 1 would require the removal of two residences; Study Area 3, three residences; and Study Area 5, up to six residences. No residences would be removed from Study Areas 2 or 4. As a result, these two study areas would be more suitable with respect to displacement of residences. Study Area 3 is located adjacent to an existing trailer park community (Leisure Lakes) at the intersection of Avenue E and SR-14. Study Area 3 is adjacent to agricultural and measured uses (including a landfill) to the south and east.

## **PUBLIC NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY**

*Potentially Significant Environmental Effects:* The LWRP 2020 Plan EIR assesses impacts for both construction and operational activities and identifies mitigation measures to avoid or reduce impacts. The recommended project would cause three significant and unavoidable impacts: (1) biological resources impacts caused by the elimination of mudflat habitat on Rosamond Dry Lake, (2) air quality impacts caused by construction emissions, and (3) secondary effects associated with the accommodation of growth in the region. Other project alternatives assessed in the EIR would add an additional significant and unavoidable impact: potential groundwater quality degradation resulting from long-term land application of recycled water.

### *Hydrology and Water Resources*

The wells also fill their pool and therapeutic whirlpool spa, which means the seniors would have constant bodily contact with this contamination, as they drink, bathe, swim, & exercise quite often in this water. The wells also supplies their lake water, where they stock their fish. Also know, these seniors eat these fish, who now are swimming & living in contaminated waters. Seniors are more delicate, and even stand to be poisoned by eating their catch.

### Chapter 4 Environmental Setting, Impacts, and Mitigation

#### **4.13.2 Environmental Impacts and Mitigation Measures**

##### *Thresholds of Significance*

According to the CEQA Guidelines, a proposed project would have a significant effect on population and housing if it:

- Induces substantial population growth in an area, either directly (for example, proposing new homes and businesses) or indirectly (for example, through extension of roads or other infrastructure).
- Displaces substantial numbers of existing housing units, necessitating the construction of replacement housing elsewhere.  
and/or

## Chapter 5 Alternatives to the Recommended Project

Public Impact

Storage reservoirs can impact the public by displacing residents and businesses or causing an insect nuisance for motorists along SR-14 or Sierra Highway. As documented in the LWRP 2020 Plan, Study Areas 1, 3, and 5 are the least desirable with respect to public impact. Aerial photographs and site surveys indicate that siting storage reservoirs within Study Area 1 would require the displacement of two residences, Study Area 3, three residences; and Study Area 5, up to six residences. No residences or businesses would be displaced from Study Areas 2 and 4. As a result, these two study areas are more desirable. It should be noted that Study Area 3 is located adjacent to Leisure Lake, a mobile home community that is located at the intersection of Avenue E and SR-14. In addition, Study Area 5 is located adjacent to industrial uses (including a landfill) to the south and east.

4.16.3 Environmental Impacts and Mitigation Measures Lancaster, Ca. 93534

#### *Thresholds of Significance*

Significance criteria under CEQA Guidelines state that a project will normally have a significant effect on the environment if it will create a potential public hazard, involve the use, production, or disposal of materials that pose a hazard to people, animal, or plant populations in the area affected, or if it would interfere with emergency response plans or emergency evacuation plans with regard to hazardous materials and chemicals.

Again, the number of people at Leisure Lake are never mentioned (300+) and the closeness of alternative #3 to these people, are never mentioned. THESE TWO things alone, make a BIG difference.

## 4.10 CHEMICALS, HAZARDOUS MATERIALS, AND ENERGY

# 2

This section assesses potential hazards that may arise as a result of the proposed project.

### 4.10.1 Environmental Setting

#### *Chemical Usage*

Chemicals used in the wastewater treatment process at the LWRP include NaOCl, ammonia, ferrous chloride, and aluminum sulfate (alum). These process chemicals are stored in several aboveground storage tanks on site. In addition to process chemicals, District No. 14 also maintains several aboveground storage tanks for propane, diesel, and gasoline. Table 4.10-1 summarizes the current and projected chemical quantities used at the LWRP for each alternative. Projected chemical usage was estimated assuming that quantities would increase commensurate with projected flow rates. Chemicals are delivered to the LWRP on a regular basis. Table 4.5-1 shows the number of deliveries per month for chemicals delivered to the LWRP.

NaOCl is currently stored in liquid form on site and is used for disinfection purposes. NaOCl solutions are used in place of gaseous chlorine, an acutely toxic chemical. NaOCl solutions are unstable and some

chlorine vapor can be released in the event of a spill. However, chlorine vapor production from using NaOCl is minimal and poses no public health risk in comparison to using pressurized gaseous chlorine. #3

Ammonia is used seasonally in conjunction with NaOCl in the disinfection process. In the event of high nitrogen levels, ammonia is added to induce production of chloramines, which aids disinfection. In the event of a spill, ammonia can vaporize into the air, remaining low to the ground. Low-lying ammonia clouds can be hazardous to nearby areas. The LWRP utilizes aqueous ammonia which is less volatile than other forms of ammonia such as anhydrous ammonia.

Ferrous chloride is also used on site for coagulation. Although ferrous chloride is not listed as an acutely hazardous material, it can become dangerous if heated to decomposition or on contact with acids or acid fumes, when it can emit highly toxic chloride fumes.

Aluminum sulfate, commonly known as alum, is a metal coagulant that enhances sedimentation. It is used during the tertiary treatment process in the final sedimentation step. Alum is a grayish-white, crystallized solid.

In addition to the treatment chemicals stored on site, District No. 14 operates a water quality laboratory at the LWRP. The laboratory stores and utilizes small quantities of chemicals used in EPA-approved testing methods.

## HISTORICAL VALUE of REDMAN

One last thing I would like to bring to your attention, is the historical value of Redman.

William Redman, who the community was named after, was a part of A.V.'s colorful past. He met Frieda Ridder, whose family (german immigrants) came from Nebraska, along with 60 families to settle Palmdale. These early families named Palmdale, Palmenthal, after palm trees. William and Frieda were married. Early 1900's William Redman was a postmaster in Lancaster, and latter he was Board of Directors to A.V. Fairgrounds. He is why we have the "Redman Grandstands." They were named after William Redman. He remained on the Board of Directors 1941 to 1955.

As another tribute to William Redman, I propose you leave something of Redman community, he would have been proud to see. The 35 acres at Leisure Lake, I believe are the only Park like grounds, literally an OASIS, and the largest, condensed population in the Redman Community, and should be preserved without the stench, contamination, and unsightly sewage reservoirs, right across the street. It seems rather sad, a waste and a loss of history to just make most of Redman, a big toilet.

Although this community rides on the coat tails of Lancaster,

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it is still Redman Co. The property's parcels across the street, (where the alternative reservoir #3 would be) from Leisure Lake are listed as being "in" Redman Co. (see attached) Mail will be and has been delivered to Leisure Lake, addressed to "Redman Calif." (See attached) I believe the community can still legally form their own Town Council. I just think many people are unaware of this. Myself and others, plan to let the community know.

Thank you for contacting me about your concerns in regard to the Lancaster Water Reclamation Plant 2020 Facilities Plan. Although my office is not directly involved in the decision-making process on this project, I am intensely interested in seeing that only the best solutions are used in meeting our Valley's needs for environmentally sound wastewater treatment and water reclamation.

I have designated a member of my staff to attend meetings and hearings concerning the 2020 Facilities Plan and to keep me apprised of developments. I will not hesitate to speak out in support of acceptable planning or to strongly oppose decisions which run counter to the best interests of the people who elected me to represent them in Sacramento.

In the case of the pond site you referenced in your letter to me, I was pleased to learn that the alternative location is NOT being supported or recommended to the County Sanitation District Board of Directors by their staff. Although the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requires that all alternatives be considered before a final decision – even those as ill-conceived as the pond proposal adjacent to Leisure Lake Mobile Home Park – I have every confidence that recommendations against the site by the Sanitation District's professional staff will be accepted.


