The Chairperson left the meeting early. Upon motion of Director Howorth, duly seconded and unanimously carried, Director Chen was elected Chairperson pro tem.

RE: PUBLIC COMMENT The Chairperson pro tem announced this was the time for any questions or comments by members of the public.  
There were no public comments or questions to address the Board on any matters.

RE: DIRECTOR FROM CITY OF REDONDO BEACH A certificate from the City Clerk of the City of Redondo Beach was presented to the Secretary stating that at a meeting of the City Council held March 5, 2024, Mr. James Light was elected Mayor of the City of Redondo Beach, which is the designation of the presiding officer of the governing body of that city and automatically places Mr. Light on this Board.

Upon motion of Director Schmitz, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the certificate was accepted and ordered filed.

RE: AMENDED CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND DISCLOSURE CODE APPROVE AND ADOPT The Chief Engineer and General Manager stated that government code requires that the Districts has a Conflict of Interest Code and Disclosure (Form 700), which is overseen by Los Angeles County. The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors recently approved the Districts COI and Disclosure. Each District must consider approval of the COI and Disclosure. He advised that at its meeting of February 27, 2024, the Districts' code reviewing body, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, adopted an amended Conflict of Interest Code and Disclosure Categories for the Districts. The amendment consists of revisions of deletion of one position from the code as it no longer exists in the agency, changes to nine position titles, addition of eleven positions to the code, and adds one position under "Officials who manage Public Investments." Pursuant to Government Code 87306, each District Board is required to adopt the amended code.

Upon motion of Director Schmitz, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the Board of Directors of South Bay Cities Sanitation District of Los Angeles County approved and adopted an amended Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Code, a copy of which is on file in the Office of the District and all the provisions of which are incorporated herein as though fully set forth. The amended code supersedes the Conflict of Interest and Disclosure Code previously adopted by this Board.

RE: SERVICE CHARGE REPORT  
RECEIVE AND ORDER FILED  
SET PUBLIC HEARING FOR  
MAY 15, 2024, AND GIVE  
REQUIRED NOTICE

Prior to meeting in regular session, the Chief Engineer and General Manager updated the Directors on the Districts' wastewater rates for the various Boards meeting today, as recorded in the Status Report presented on this date.

A report titled *South Bay Cities Sanitation District Service Charge Report for Fiscal Year 2024-25*, prepared in accordance with Section 5473 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California and which establishes the formula for the calculation of a sewage unit that represents the average daily quantity of sewage flow and strength from a single-family home (SFH) was presented.

Filing of the Service Charge Report is required each year to collect the wastewater service charge on the property tax roll. The current service charge rate per single-family home is \$6.25 per month (\$75 per year), and no increase is recommended for fiscal year 2024-25. A letter discussing the service charge rate, the fiscal year 2024-25 preliminary budget, and related matters accompanies the agenda. Staff recommends the Public Hearing be held at the Board meeting scheduled for May 15, 2024. This item is consistent with the Districts' Guiding Principles of commitment to fiscal responsibility and prudent financial stewardship; and to plan for both short-term and long-term needs to minimize the need for significant rate increases.

A recommendation was made that, in accordance with Section 5473 of the Health and Safety Code, the Board instruct the District Clerk to publish newspaper notices to inform the public of the date, time, and place for a public hearing on the Service Charge Report, and that a public hearing be set for May 15, 2024, at 1:30 p.m. in the Torrance City Hall, Third Floor Assembly Room, 3031 Torrance Boulevard, Torrance, California, for the purpose of public discussion of the proposed service charge and its collection on the property tax roll. After the public hearing is closed, the Board must consider adoption of the Service Charge Report and introduction of ordinances establishing the service charge rates and providing for the collection of the service charge on the property tax roll.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board does hereby fix May 15, 2024, at 1:30 p.m. as the date and time, and in the Torrance City Hall, Third Floor Assembly Room, 3031 Torrance Boulevard, Torrance, California, as the place for a public hearing on *South Bay Cities Sanitation District Service Charge Report for Fiscal Year 2024-25*, the proposed service charge and the collection of the service charge on the property tax roll.

The Clerk of this Board shall cause notice of the filing of the Service Charge Report and the time and place of the public hearing to be published once a week for two successive weeks in *The Daily Breeze*, a daily newspaper printed and published within the District, and in such other publications as are deemed appropriate by the Chief Engineer and General Manager.

Upon motion of Director Schmitz, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the *South Bay Cities Sanitation District Service Charge Report for Fiscal Year 2024-25* was ordered filed with the Clerk of the District.

Upon motion of Director Murdock, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the was meeting adjourned.
