4. Accept Contract No. 5470 and Order Final Payment to Olsson Construction, Inc., for Construction of *Saugus Water Reclamation Plant Primary Structures Concrete Repairs* (Project), Resulting in Total Contract Amount of \$7,539,073.17

Summary: This Project consisted of repairing corroded concrete surfaces and replacing deteriorated protective coating and lining systems in existing tanks and channels at the plant. Sixteen change orders totaling \$280,563.79 were approved for this Project.

5. Re: Technical Studies in Santa Clara River for Temperature Compliance
  - (a) Authorize Issuance of Purchase Order to University of California, Davis (UCD) in Amount of Approximately \$260,200 for Phase 1 Laboratory Fish Studies
  - (b) Authorize Issuance of Purchase Order to Environmental Science Associates (ESA) in Amount of Approximately \$310,000 for Technical Studies and Monitoring Activities

Summary: The Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board) lowered temperature requirements in surface water discharge permits issued to the Saugus and Valencia Water Reclamation Plants (WRPs). Because the WRPs cannot immediately comply with the new requirements, the Regional Board established an eight-year schedule to bring each plant into compliance. The schedule allows the District to conduct temperature studies in the Santa Clara River (SCR) and, if appropriate, propose new site-specific temperature requirements that are protective of the river and which the plants can comply with. Through a competitive request for proposals process, ESA and UCD were retained to provide consulting and expert services to assess the effects of river temperatures on aquatic life. Prior purchase orders were issued to ESA for various monitoring and biological studies for this work. Funds in the amount of approximately \$310,000 are now necessary for additional work including expanded river temperature monitoring, additional technical studies, and river temperature and habitat modeling. Laboratory fish studies at UCD are also recommended to fill key data gaps on the thermal tolerance of the endangered unarmored threespine stickleback (UTS), which have been previously identified in the SCR. A surrogate species will be collected from the local SCR watershed and used in the laboratory studies in lieu of using UTS, and data collected from these studies may be used to support new temperature requirements. UCD has provided a scope of work and cost proposal for the laboratory fish studies, to be conducted in two phases: Phase 1 thermal tests on adult fish at a cost of approximately \$260,200 and Phase 2 thermal tests on embryos and juvenile fish at a cost of approximately \$250,800.

## 5. Contd.

Approval for Phase 2 studies will be requested if the Phase 1 studies are successful and provide relevant information to better understand the thermal tolerance of UTS. Staff has determined that the activities described herein are exempt or otherwise not subject to the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations (“CEQA Guidelines”) Sections 15306, 15307 and 15308. This item is consistent with the Districts’ Guiding Principle of commitment to operational excellence (protection of public health and the environment, regulatory compliance, and cost effectiveness).

**Summary:** A letter describing the required Board actions together with a copy of the Service Charge Report and the proposed service charge rate, industrial wastewater rate and connection fee rate ordinances, accompany the agenda. The actions will implement the new rates and will allow the wastewater service charge to continue to be collected on the property tax roll. The rates shown in the various documents and the Proposition 218 notice represent the maximum of the two options previously discussed at the March 18, 2024, Board meeting. At a future meeting, before adoption of the rate ordinances, the Board may elect to adopt lower rates that align with one of the two previously discussed options. Staff recommends a Combined Public Hearing be held at the Board meeting scheduled for May 20, 2024. This item is consistent with the Districts’ Guiding Principles of commitment to fiscal responsibility and prudent financial stewardship; and to plan for both short-term and long-term needs to minimize the need for significant rate increases.

## 7. CLOSED SESSION - Re: Update on Consideration of Newhall Land and Farming Company (NLFC) Proposal Regarding Provision of Regional Sewerage Service with Newhall Ranch Sanitation District (NRSD)

**Summary:** At the February 2024 Board meeting, the Chief Engineer and General Manager discussed NLFC’s request for minor revisions to the Joint Sewerage Services Agreement for cross-boundary flow between the Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District (SCVSD) and NRSD affecting the construction schedule of the future Newhall Ranch Water Reclamation Plant (WRP). In exchange for SCVSD’s support of these minor changes, NLFC has offered to provide SCVSD an option to purchase land near the Valencia WRP and funding for an updated planning study for SCVSD treatment facilities. The Chief Engineer and General Manager will provide updates on staff negotiations with NLFC based on direction received from the Board at the March 2024 meeting. This item is consistent with the Districts’ Guiding Principle to provide reliable and responsible services with safety first. *The Board will meet in closed session pursuant to the provisions of California Government Code Section 54956.8, Conference with Real Property Negotiators, to discuss potential purchase price and terms of payment for the parcels of land shown on the attached map; District Negotiators: Robert C. Ferrante and Raymond L. Tremblay.*

**Wastewater Revenue Program for FY 2024-25 through FY 2028-29**

The agenda for the April 15, 2024, meeting of the Board of Directors of Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District, contains items regarding the District’s wastewater revenue program. This program requires residential, commercial, and industrial dischargers to pay an annual user charge based upon their use of the Districts’ sewerage facilities.

**SERVICE CHARGE AND SURCHARGE RATES**

Residential, commercial, and small industrial dischargers are covered by the service charge program, which collects user charges on the property tax roll. Large industrial dischargers are required to file surcharge statements and to pay their user charge under the industrial wastewater surcharge program. Service charge rates (for residential and commercial users) and surcharge rates (for industrial users) are intended to ensure revenues adequately fund operational costs, upcoming capital projects, and help the District meet the targets in its Board-adopted reserve and debt policies.

The service charge rate is currently \$30.83 per month (\$370 per year) per single-family home. At the January 16, February 20, and March 18, 2024, Board meetings, staff discussed budgetary needs, proposed service charge rates, and the rate ordinance implementation process. At the March 18, 2024, meeting, staff requested Board direction on the proposed rate increases and authorization to publish the required Proposition 218 notices. The Board directed staff to present two options to the public for how the proposed rates could be structured and to seek public input on which proposed rate structure they believe should be used. Rate Structure 1 has a larger increase up front followed by smaller increases, closer to inflation. Rate Structure 2 has a more gradual increase in rates, but results in a higher rate in five years. Both annual rate structures are shown in the table below.

The annual rates listed in the table below are the maximum of the two Rate Structures, and are the rates currently presented in the Proposition 218 notice and the ordinances and related documents. The final adopted rate may be as high as these rates shown for any given year, but the ordinances may be modified before adoption to reflect one of the Rate Structure alternatives.

Multi-family residential units will pay 60% of the adopted single-family home rate and condominiums will pay 75% of the adopted single-family home rate. Likewise, commercial and industrial dischargers will pay in proportion to their use of the wastewater management system compared to a single-family home. Dischargers with verified low water usage (particularly seniors and retirees) may also qualify for a reduced charge. Copies of the proposed Surcharge Rate and Industrial Wastewater Surcharge Rate Ordinances are attached to the agenda. If approved, the new Ordinances will take effect July 1, 2024.

### CONNECTION FEE RATES

New connection fee rates are also being proposed for fiscal years 2024-25 through 2028-29. Wastewater connection fees are paid by new dischargers or existing dischargers who increase their discharge. The fees are calculated using a “buy-in” methodology where new users or increasing discharges buy-in to the existing facilities and funds. The proposed connection fee rates reflect the current net assets of the District on a per-capacity unit basis, plus an operational component equivalent to one year of service charge. As with the service charge rates, the operational component of the connection fee may be adjusted before adoption to reflect the final service charge rate. A copy of the proposed Connection Fee Rate Ordinance is attached to the agenda.

### COLLECTION OF SERVICE CHARGES ON THE TAX ROLL

The agenda also contains actions to allow for continued collection of the District’s service charges for residential, commercial, and small industrial dischargers on the property tax roll. Specifically, pursuant to state law, the Board must (1) order a Service Charge Report be filed with the District Clerk, (2) establish the date, time, and place for a public hearing on the report, and (3) direct the publication of the required notices and revise date, time, and place for public hearing if required due to scheduling conflicts. Subsequent adoption of the Service Charge Report, as is required under the California Health and Safety Code, is necessary for the District to continue to collect the approved wastewater service charge as a separate line item on the property tax roll. This is the most cost-effective and efficient means of collecting the service charges.

### LOW WATER REBATE PROGRAM

The cost of metering wastewater discharges from individual parcels is impractical and cost prohibitive. Hence, discharges are estimated using standard loading factors based on the size and types of facilities located on the parcel. With ongoing efforts by local communities to conserve water and install low-flow plumbing fixtures, many parcels may be discharging at lower rates than currently estimated. The Districts’ Low Water Rebate Program allows parcel owners to apply for a reduction in their service charge rate based on their actual water usage. Staff has conducted a concerted public outreach program, including information on the program in our Proposition 218 notices, newspaper advertisements, and the Districts’ website, to ensure parcel owners are aware of the program.

### SUMMARY OF REQUIRED ACTIONS

To implement new rates, the District must comply with the requirements of both Proposition 218 and the California Health & Safety Code. The first step is to order a Service Charge Report (copy attached) to be filed with the District Clerk. This report contains a description and the amount of the proposed service charge for each parcel, serving as the initial notification to rate payers that new rates are being considered. It also acts as the starting point for the Proposition 218 process in which individual notices are mailed to every property owner in the District. By law, the notice must provide information about the proposed rates and the date, time, and place for a public hearing on those rates. In addition to these minimum requirements, the notice also gives background information about the

services being provided, details about a notice through which dischargers can save money (the Low-Water Rebate Program), the process for protesting the rates, and a variety of methods by which they can contact Districts' staff for more information. At the same time the Service Charge Report is filed, the Board will be asked to introduce new service charge, industrial wastewater surcharge, and connection fee rate ordinances for the public's review.

At least 45 days after the Proposition 218 notices are mailed, the Board must hold a public hearing on the proposed rates. It is recommended that the public hearing be set for the date, time and location listed on the agenda. The Board may consider modification of the rates in the proposed ordinances and Service Charge Report. If the rates are modified, adoption of the Service Charge Report and adoption of the service charge, industrial wastewater surcharge, and connection fee rate ordinances will be considered at a regular meeting, or adjourned regular meeting, at least five days after the modification. To ensure the new rates become effective on July 1, 2024, adoption needs to occur before June 1, 2024.

During the 45-day noticing period, the District will undertake an extensive public outreach program. As in past years, staff will hold a number of information meetings. A video of the same presentation made at the information meetings will be made available on the Districts' website. In addition, a tour of a District's treatment facility will be conducted for members of the community who have a greater desire to see exactly how their money is being spent. The website has information and documents pertaining to the District's finances and will have detailed information about the proposed rate increase. The website also provides information on each owner's specific parcel and charges and explains the Low-Water Rebate Program and opportunities for reducing their charges. Lastly, the Districts have a dedicated toll-free telephone number with staff available to answer any questions the public may have.

At the June meeting, a final budget will be presented to the Board of Directors for consideration as part of the overall budgetary process, adoption of which will authorize budget appropriations. In addition, the Board must take certain administrative actions that are required of all agencies that receive ad valorem taxes. These include establishing by resolution the amount of the tax levy the District will request from the Los Angeles County Tax Collector and adopting a limit on authorized expenditures of tax proceeds.

# SANTA CLARITA VALLEY SANITATION DISTRICT SERVICE CHARGE REPORT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024-25

## INTRODUCTION

The Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County (District) encompasses portions of the city of Santa Clarita and some of the surrounding unincorporated Los Angeles County.

The District provides wastewater management services for the area described above. The District is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Saugus and Valencia Water Reclamation Plants and the large trunk sewers which convey wastewater to these facilities. These services are essential to protect the public health of the people served by the system.

The District must provide the revenue required to operate and maintain its facilities. The general revenue sources currently available to the District include a pro rata share of the ad valorem (property) taxes, service charges, industrial wastewater surcharges, grants, state low-interest loans, interest income, contract revenue and reserves. Any surplus will be transferred to designated reserves to meet targeted reserve requirements.

## PROPOSED SYSTEM DESCRIPTION

The service charge revenue required pursuant to the *Master Service Charge Ordinance of Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County* will be allocated among classes of developed parcels of real property on the basis of use of the sewerage system. The revenue derived from the service charge will be used for operation and maintenance and capital costs.

All industrial dischargers in the District discharging more than 1.0 million gallons per year are required to file a wastewater surcharge statement as prescribed in the *Wastewater Ordinance* to pay their appropriate share of the costs based on their use of the sewerage system. All other users of the sewerage system, except for contractual and local government users, will pay service charges.

The basic term used to define the service charge is a sewage unit. A sewage unit represents the average daily quantity of sewage flow and strength from a single-family home measured in terms of flow, chemical oxygen demand (COD), and suspended solids (SS). The number of sewage units (SU) per unit of measure shall be determined by the following formula:

$$\text{SU} = A \left( \frac{\text{FLOW}_{\text{avg}}}{\text{FLOW}_{\text{sfh}}} \right) + B \left( \frac{\text{COD}_{\text{avg}}}{\text{COD}_{\text{sfh}}} \right) + C \left( \frac{\text{SS}_{\text{avg}}}{\text{SS}_{\text{sfh}}} \right)$$

where:

- A = The proportion of the total operation and maintenance and capital costs required for conveyance, treatment, and disposal of wastewater for the fiscal year which is attributable to flow;
- B = The proportion of the total operation and maintenance and capital costs required for conveyance, treatment, and disposal of wastewater for the fiscal year which is attributable to COD;
- C = The proportion of the total operation and maintenance and capital costs required for conveyance, treatment, and disposal of wastewater for the fiscal year which is attributable to suspended solids;

- $FLOW_{sfh}$  = Average flow of wastewater from a single-family home in gallons per day;  
 $COD_{sfh}$  = Average loading of COD in the wastewater from a single-family home in pounds per day;  
 $SS_{sfh}$  = Average loading of suspended solids in the wastewater from a single-family home in pounds per day;  
 $FLOW_{avg}$  = Estimated flow of wastewater which will enter the sewerage system from a user in gallons per day;  
 $COD_{avg}$  = Estimated loading of COD which will enter the sewerage system from a user in pounds per day;  
 $SS_{avg}$  = Estimated loading of suspended solids which will enter the sewerage system from a user in pounds per day.

For fiscal year 2024-25, the proportions of the total operation and maintenance and capital costs attributable to flow, COD, and SS have been assigned the following values:

A	=	0.2798
B	=	0.3239
C	=	0.3963

The service charge for each parcel is determined by multiplying the service charge rate by the number of sewage units attributable to the parcel. The sewage units attributable to a given parcel are determined by using the sewage unit formula above and the flow, COD, and SS loadings from **Table 1**, which shows the corresponding values for each class of real property in the District. The number of sewage units attributable to a given parcel may be reduced pursuant to the terms of the *Master Service Charge Ordinance of Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County* if the verifiable water usage attributable to the parcel is significantly less than that calculated using the values in **Table 1**.

Based upon presently anticipated sources of funds, the service charge rate for fiscal year 2024-25 is \$437 per sewage unit. Parcels with significantly lower water usage may be eligible for a reduced rate pursuant to the terms of the *Master Service Charge Ordinance of Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County*.

**DESCRIPTION OF PARCELS RECEIVING SERVICES AND IDENTIFICATION OF AMOUNT OF CHARGE FOR EACH PARCEL**

Unless not connected to the sewerage system, all parcels of real property within the 2024-25 Tax Rate Areas (TRAs) as shown in **Table 2** are receiving or benefiting from the services and facilities of the District. Additionally, the parcels listed in **Table 3**, which are not within the TRAs, are also receiving or benefiting from the services and facilities of the District. Said parcels are more particularly described in maps prepared in accordance with Section 327, Revenue and Taxation Code, which are on file in the office of the County Assessor, which maps are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

All commercial and institutional parcels assessed a service charge based on the Los Angeles County Assessor's current tax roll shall be charged on the basis of not less than one (1.0) sewage unit.

No charge shall be imposed on the owner or owners of any parcels as to which the fair market value of improvements is less than \$1,000 as determined on the basis of the Assessor's current tax roll. This assumption is predicated on the fact that this type of parcel would be a vacant piece of land; however, should subsequent evaluation reveal that the property is not vacant, then an appropriate service charge would be levied.

## SECTION 3.0 – COST ALLOCATION FACTORS

Pursuant to Section 3.04(1) of the *Master Connection Fee Ordinance of Santa Clarita Valley Sanitation District of Los Angeles County*, the proportions of the total capital costs required to construct the sewerage system including conveyance, treatment, and disposal of wastewater which are attributable to flow, COD, and suspended solids, designated as X, Y, and Z, respectively, to be effective on the dates given, shall be:

$$X = 0.5498 \quad Y = 0.1849 \quad Z = 0.2653$$

**SECTION 4.0 – VALIDITY**

If any part, section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional for any reason by any court, that decision does not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remainder of this Ordinance. 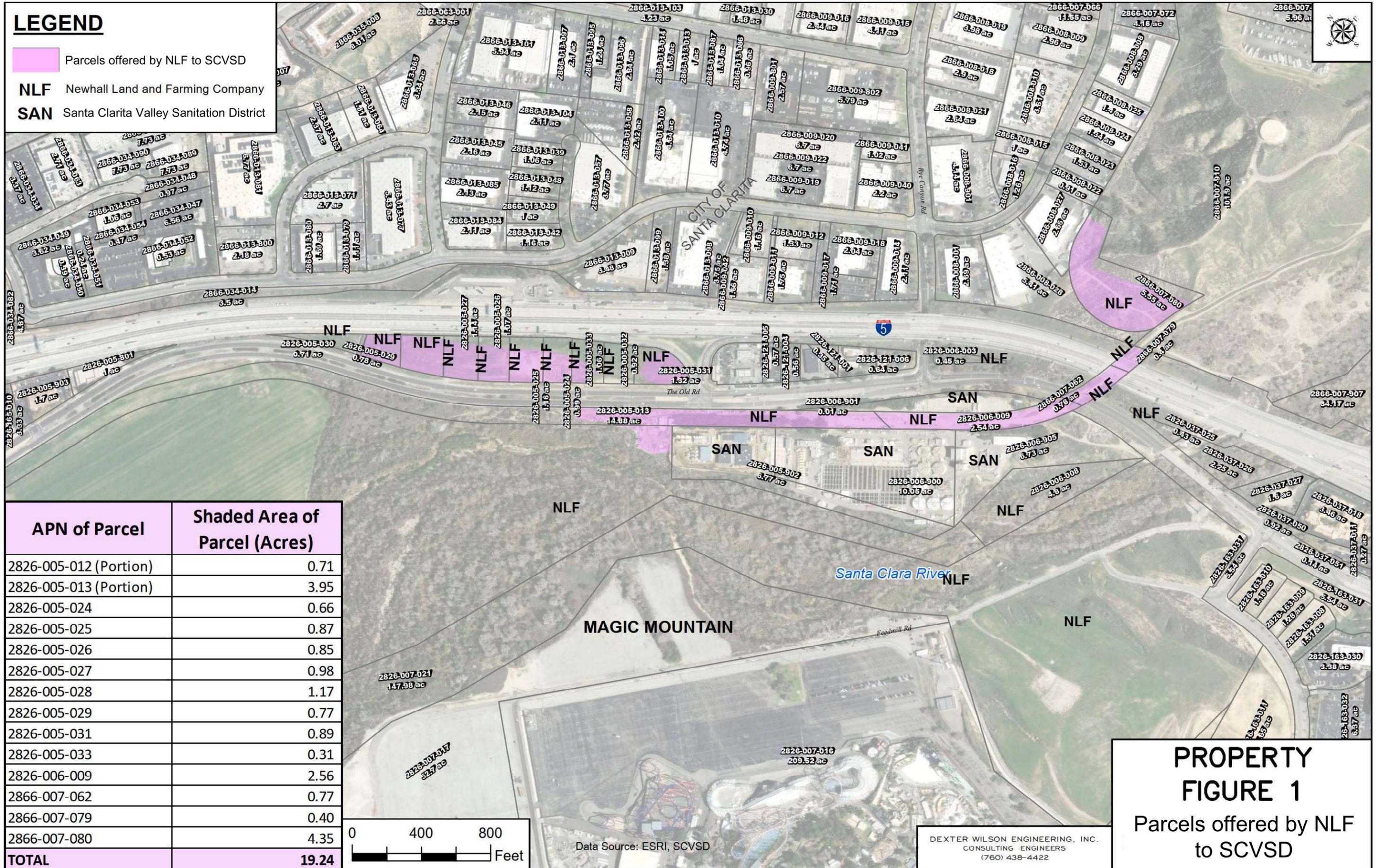

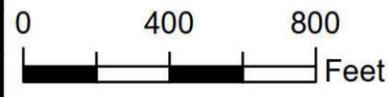
