Rupam Soni, Metropolitan Water District of Southern California

The Advanced Purification Center is a 0.5 million gallon per day demonstration facility that will generate information needed for the potential future construction of a full-scale recycled water plant. It uses a unique application of membrane bioreactors designed to significantly increase efficiency in water recycling. Scientists and engineers will test the process, utilizing full-scale treatment modules, to ensure the resulting purified water meets the highest water quality standards. A full-scale regional recycled water program would produce up to 150 million gallons daily, enough to serve more than 500,000 homes. Purified water from the advanced treatment facility would be delivered through 60 miles of new pipelines to the region's groundwater basins, industrial facilities, and two of Metropolitan Water District's treatment plants.

DIRECTIONS AND PARKING

The Center is located on the campus of the Joint Water Pollution Control Plant, located at 24501 S. Figueroa Street in Carson. Using a map application will send you to the general vicinity of the Center, but use the specified directions below to arrive at the exact tour location. Please note that some map functions may display Wilmington instead of Carson, and this is still the correct address.

Traveling South on Figueroa (From Sepulveda):

- Continue south and pass the railroad tracks
- Look for a blue sign for the Center on your left
- Turn left into the driveway just before the sign and let the security guard know you are attending a Center tour
- Continue straight after the gate and follow banners to the Center
- Park in the small lot on the right by the facility or in the open area on the left
- Walk to the Learning Center Trailer to check in for your tour

Traveling North on Figueroa (From PCH or Lomita):

Key Legislative Issues: Plastics

- Circular Economy & Plastic Pollution Reduction
 - SB 54 (Allen) / AB 1080 (Gonzalez)
 - Passed 1st house. Companion bills.
 - AB 129 (Bloom) & AB 223 (Stone)
 - Stalled in 1st house. 2-year bill.




Key Legislative Issues: Wipes

- Labeling for "Flushable" Wipes.
 - AB 1672 (Bloom)
 - Stalled in 1st house. 2-year bill.



Key Legislative Issues: Toxics

- Green Chemistry Program
 - SB 392 (Allen)
 - Passed 1st house.
- CA Safe Cosmetics Act
 - AB 495 (Muratsuchi)
 - Stalled in 1st house. 2-year bill.
- Toxic Fragrance Chemicals Right to Know Act
 - SB 574 (Leyva)
 - Passed 1st House.





Key Legislative Issues: Ocean Discharge & Resiliency

- Ocean Discharge Prohibition (95% Recycling Requirement)
 - SB 332 (Hertzberg & Wiener)
 - Stalled in 1st house. 2-year bill.
- Ocean Resiliency Act
 - SB 69 (Wiener)
 - Passed 1st house.





Key Legislative Issues: Stormwater

- General Industrial Stormwater Permit Compliance Check
 - SB 205 (Hertzberg)
 - Passed 1st house.
- Tire Fee for MS4 Compliance
 - AB 755 (Holden)
 - Stalled in 1st house. 2-year bill.
- Water Board to Adopt Guidelines for Assessing Financial Capability for MS4 Permittees
 - AB 1093 (Rubio)
 - Passed 1st house.





Key Legislative Issues: PFAS

- PFAS (Per- and polyfluoroalkyl Substances)
 - AB 756 (C. Garcia) & AB 841 (Ting)
 - Passed 1st house.



Key Legislative Issues: Air Quality

- Heavy-Duty Vehicle Inspection and Maintenance Program
 - SB 210 (Leyva)
 - Passed 1st house.

Requires the state board, no later than 2 years after completion of the pilot program, to develop and implement a heavy-duty vehicle inspection and maintenance program for non-gasoline heavy-duty on-road motor vehicles.
