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Legislative Process & Schedule

- Bill introduction deadline: Feb. 22
- Policy Com hearings: March-April
- Fiscal Com hearings: April – May
- Floor of first house: end of May
- State Budget deadline: June 15
- Then repeat in other house: July - Sept
- Summer recess: July 12 - Aug 12
- Adjournment: Sept 13
- Last day for Gov to sign/veto: Oct 13
- Statutes take effect: Jan 1, 2020



2019 Legislative Outlook

- New Governor
- New 2-year legislative session
- Dems have “super-duper” majorities (Asm=61; Sen=28 (2 vacancies))
- Top level issues
 - Housing
 - Wildfires
- Environmental caucus: 65 members; both parties. Co-chaired by Sen. Ben Allen & Asm. Mark Stone.

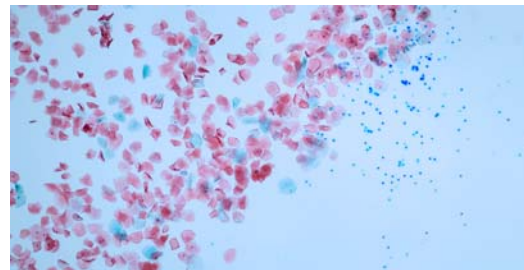
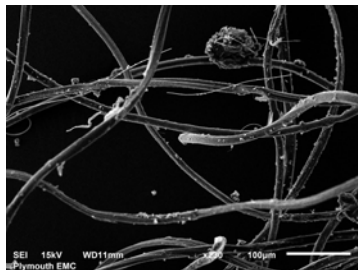


Key Legislative Issues: Plastics

- Circular Economy & plastic pollution reduction
 - SB 54 (Allen)/AB 1080 (Gonzales)



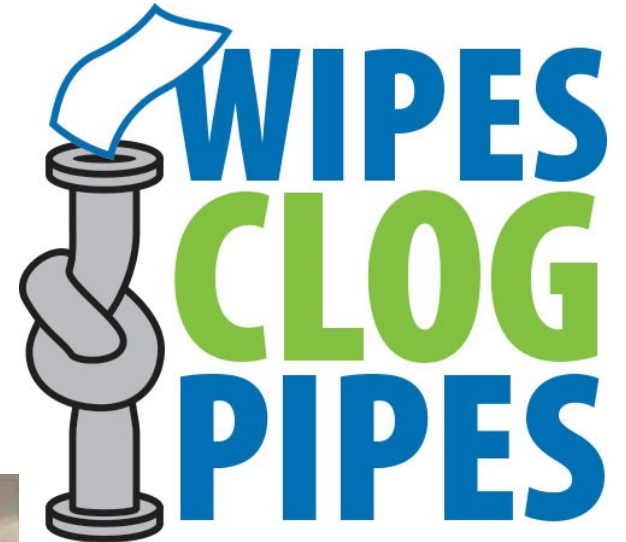
- Microplastics
 - AB 129 (Bloom), AB 223 (Stone)





Key Legislative Issues: Wipes

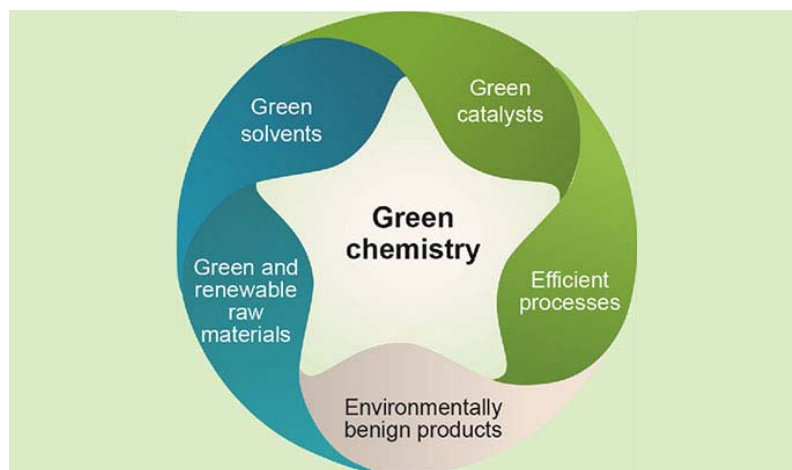
- Labeling for “Flushable” Wipes
 - AB 1672 (Bloom)





Key Legislative Issues: Toxics

- SB 392 (Allen) –
Green Chemistry program



- AB 495 (Muratsuchi) – CA Safe Cosmetics Act
- SB 574 (Leyva) – Toxic Fragrance Chemicals Right to Know Act



Key Legislative Issues: Ocean Discharge & Resiliency

- SB 332 (Hertzberg & Weiner) – ocean discharge prohibition (95% recycling requirement)
- SB 69 (Weiner) – Ocean Resiliency Act – focus on ocean acidification & hypoxia





Key Legislative Issues: Stormwater

- SB 205 (Hertzberg) – for industries regulated under the General Industrial Stormwater Permit, requires a compliance check as a condition of getting a business license from a city or county
- AB 755 (Holden) – adds new tire fee for zinc remediation; \$ for MS4 compliance with zinc TMDLs
- AB 1093 (Rubio) – requires Water Boards to adopt guidelines for assessing financial capability for MS4 permittees





Key Legislative & Regulatory Issues: PFAS/PFOA



- PFAS/PFOA – per and polyfluorinated compounds
 - AB 756 & AB 841
- SWRCB 13267 Orders – new testing requirements
- National focus
 - EPA PFAS Action Plan
 - Federal legislation



Key Regulatory Issues: Organic Waste

- SB 1383 (2016):
 - Short-lived climate pollutant reduction
 - organic waste diversion regulations
 - 50% (11.5m tons/yr) diversion of organics by 2020;
 - 75% (17.2m tons/yr) diversion of organics by 2025;
 - 20% (5.6m tons/yr) edible food recovery by 2025.
 - draft regulations released by CalRecycle in Dec. '18; public comments were due in March
 - Will take effect 2022
 - New infrastructure: 100-200 new facilities, \$2-3 bil
