RE: REFINANCING OF DISTRICT DEBT **DISCUSS**

The Chief Engineer and General Manager reported that over the last 15 years, the District has constructed a

number of large capital projects, most significant of which was the expansion of the Lancaster Water Reclamation Plant in 2005. Bonds issued in 2005 (and subsequently refunded in 2015) and State Revolving Fund loans were used to fund the work. The total principal balance of the debt is approximately \$187 million with an average interest rate of 4.5 percent. There is an opportunity to refund the existing debt with new bonds and save roughly \$1 million per year over 15 years.

Upon motion of Director Hofbauer, duly seconded and unanimously carried by a roll-call vote, the report was received and filed and the Board endorsed District staff to move forward with refinancing the existing debt with new bonds.

In connection with the District's Eastern Agricultural Effluent Management farmland, the Chairperson pro tem stated that the use of unused corners, approximately 10 acres per corner, of the District's farming property could be used for nonprofits farming operation. He spoke with the District's farmers and stated that they will help with plowing.

He requested that staff bring a proposal to the Board that would provide use of District water at a reduced rate. He surmised that only 1-2.5 AF of water would be needed. Donating water and land would be a good thing for the District and the farmers will clear the land and help.

Director Hofbauer suggested using a sublease with the District's farmer. Director Barger stated she endorsed this matter.

The Chief Engineer and General Manager stated that there is no recycled water available. All of the recycled water is contracted out. The District does have approximately 100 AF of groundwater that could be made available. He stated that at the next meeting staff would bring back some options.
